ANGLE LAKE RESIDENT TURNS 100

Beulah Maie (Arthur) Pepper, post 12, has celebrated her 100th birthday. The celebration was held at the Des Moines yacht club on February 14th, two days before her 100th birthday.

Beulah is the second child of John and Maie (Scofield) Arthur. The children of



John and Maie were Norman the oldest, Beulah, Florence, Douglas & Peggy. The only surviving children are Beulah and Peggy 18 years junior to Beulah.

John and Maie purchased the

lot at 3504 s 198th in 1932. The lot was undeveloped raw land. The family then living in West Seattle off California Ave spent the next two years clearing the land and preparing the beach front. With the help of a local carpenter, John built a 900sq ft home and moved his family to the lake in 1934.

Beulah married Leslie Pepper in 1934 and moved back to West Seattle. Beulah and Leslie had three children Raymond born in 1939, James born in 1941, and Robert born in 1946. All raised in West Seattle.

In 1950 Leslie and Beulah and John and Maie purchased the two adjoining lots and combined them into two 60 ft properties. In 1960 Leslie's work took them to Spokane Wash followed by a move to Anchorage Alaska. Then in 1969, Beulah and Leslie moved back to Washington and moved in to the home at 3508 s 198th.

Beulah has 3 Grand children and 5 great Grand children.

When asked as to what she feels has led to her living to 100, she relates how her mother felt she was to skinny as a growing child and began to give her a table spoon of Cod liver oil every day, a regiment that she has continued to this day. Being of the depression era hard work and growing your own vegetables is also on the list of her path to longevity.
