### A FUN DAY AT THE RACES!

This year's 2nd annual ANGLE LAKE CLASSIC HORSE 'N' AROUND RACE delivered about everything you could hope for and then some!

Of course weather is always a concern but this year it cooperated and was nothing short of ideal for our 'farewell to summer' picnic. The day started with a long meeting between the judges and our event challenged designers to review all the rules for the event. With a total purse of \$1,125.00 at stake, our twelve (12) teams, who paid an entry fee of \$75.00 per team (each team consisting of 3 team members) then met with the judges for their pre-race orientation. It was time to open up the bar and fire up the grills; I must say that not only did our bartenders and chefs do a fantastic job in running their areas, but the burgers and dogs were some of the best I've tasted and the specialty drinks were a treat in themselves.

Everyone in attendance was issued \$50.00 in play money and the teams (or horses if you will) were officially introduced to the crowd. After a colorful introduction everyone was allowed to place bets (similar to betting on the horses at the track) using only the play money they had received. The plan was that like the teams competing for win, place and show so would are bettors be competing for a total purse of \$350.00 rewarding those achieving the three highest earnings.



At 1:15 pm the betting booth closed and I opened the races with a tribute to not only those who perished on 9-11 but also to our brave men and women in uniform for their service to this great country of ours.

Alexis Jones, one of Fran Reid's students, then graced us with a heartwarming acapella rendition of the National Anthem followed by a touching sing-a-long to the tune of Lee Greenwood's 'I'M PROUD TO BE AN AMERICAN'. It was a moment I was very proud to have been a part of. Then we brought the 'horses' to the starting gate a little after 1:30 p.m. 'THEY WERE OFF' competing in their first of 7 events, CHOPPED NUTS. This year we tried something a bit different. ### **CLEAN SWEEP EVENT RECAP**

On Saturday, July 23<sup>rd</sup>, volunteers, working with the City of SeaTac Parks and Recreation Department took to the waters and shorelines of Angle Lake in our first Annual Angle Lake Clean Sweep event. Armed with boats, diving gear, garbage bags, and other trash collection tools, this group of proactive citizens broke up into groups consisting of walkers assigned to the shoreline, waders and snorkelers assigned to the shallow waters and divers for the depths down to about 30 feet. Not only did the effort result in removing almost a ton of small debris consisting of cans, bottles,

car keys, cell phones, knives and other interesting items, also removed was one large submerged



vinyl flotation island (quite a task) and two abandoned rotting docks whose ownership could not be determined. While this effort only put a small dent in the amount of debris observed along the western shoreline and lake bed, we hope that next year will draw an even larger turnout so our effort can be rewarded with at least double the debris being removed. Thank you to all of you that took the time to help preserve the cleanliness of this very important natural resource! - Dress up in costume over your swimsuit to add whimsy
- Come early! Parking is limited. Carpool or come by boat.
- Anyone with heart problems should consult your health care provider before participating. If you don't participate, you're still welcome to join us and watch.
- Do not drink. Alcohol does not warm you up. It accelerates hypothermia.
- Do not stay in the water longer than 15 minutes. Body heat is lost 25 times faster in the water than in air.
- Keep your outer clothing on until swim time and remove any wet clothing before getting back into dry clothes.
