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FIREWORKS AND THE CITY OF SEATAC

Once again, the ALSC is pleased to announce that the City of SeaTac will be our co-sponsor for this year's Fireworks Display, paying for just over half the show costs making it one of the best shows you'll find in King County. While we need to thank the City this year it is also everyone of us, the taxpayers, who should be patting each other on the back for supporting this worth celebration. It not only celebrates our freedom as a nation and individuals but also the effort of a community committed to the improvement of their city and neighborhood. HOWEVER I WANT TO EXTEND THIS WORD OF CAUTION to all those taxpayers who support the City's funding.

MAYOR TERRY ANDERSON under the pressure of a few citizens has publicly stated that this will be the last year the City will participate in funding the fireworks. In addition you have GENE FISHER, RICK FORSCHLER AND PAM FERNALD who will also be OPPOSING CITY FUNDING OF THE FIREWORKS.

If you want to maintain the quality of show we have been providing these past few years and the City does not renew their support then we need to take one or more of the following actions.

- 1. Raise the suggested donation to from \$75 to \$100 dollars for every household or;
- 2. Secure alternative funding from local businesses to offset the loss of City funding or;
- 3. Or lobby the heck out of our council members by letting them know we want the City to continue cosponsoring the fireworks even if at a reduced rate while we increase funding from private sources.



Keep in mind that we now have a show that can be easily seen all around the lake and surrounding community due to the bigger shells that we are launching. Less money will mean smaller and less shells. This results in a less spectacular show and, with smaller shells, a show that may be more obscured by trees or buildings in your vicinity. We're glad to fight city hall for this funding but we can't do it alone. WE NEED YOUR SUPPORT. WE NEED YOU TO RELENTLESSLY CONTACT OUR

CONCIL MEMBERS AND LET THEM KNOW THAT WE WANT THE CITY'S SUPPORT. CALL OR E-MAIL THEM, and let them know what you think. Also keep in mind that with a position of "NO CITY FUNDIND", will, or better, should, the city still leave the park open after dusk to allow the general public to view what will again become OUR PRIVATE SHOW!!! And without City funding will our group of nay saying elected officials go so far as to eventually outlaw our private show?

Finally it should be a real

concern of all SeaTac citizens as to why there is reluctance to fund the only major event, that the city helps sponsors for the taxpayer,that is still supported privately by homeowners, attended by all city residences, even thou other municipalities this size spend upwards of 10 times this amount on multiple events for its taxpayers. Remember to vote next time around for a candidate that can tell us where our tax receipts are really being funneled to and who for . . .

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FIREWORKS DONATION TIME

In order to enjoy the events put on each year by the ALSC, we need our neighborhood support! The 4th of July along with the Fireworks Show, is

our biggest and most notable event of our clubs history. Our volunteers will be coming around between June 14th and July 3rd to collect donations for the fireworks. They will also be selling Tasty

can. Again this year's suggested donation shall again be \$75.00 per household located on the lake, \$50.00 for those living just off the lake and \$25.00 for all others; how-

It really is a small price to pay for the luxury of having front row seats to one of the best shows in the area.

EVENTS FOR THIS YEARS 4th OF JULY CELEBRATION

What can I say about the events for this year's 4th of July. Pretty much the usual fare. We'll start in the morning with the PARADE sponsored by our very own Manor Club, followed by the RUN AROUND THE LAKE, DOCK JUDGING, SWIM RACES, BOAT RACES and close out the evening with our annual FIREWORKS SHOW.

But it's not what I can 'SAY' about these events, it's rather what you can do about them.

PARADE (9:30) Get out and enjoy the parade. Better yet, take your kids, grandkids, friends, dogs, cats, floats, whatever and 'join in' the parade. It's a fun family neighborhood affair that will leave you all warm and fuzzy inside.

RUN AROUND THE LAKE (11:00 walkers and 11:30

runners) Enter the run around the lake and see if it will be you that wins a ribbon or better yet, takes the trophy from last year's winner to display in your home and give you bragging rights as the fastest runner in our community until it is time to defend it the following year.

SWIM RACES (3:00) Enter the swim races and see if it will be you that wins a silver dollar for the kids, a ribbon for adults or better yet takes the trophy from last year's winner to display in your home and give you bragging rights as the fastest swimmer in our com-

munity until it is time to defend it the following year.

BOAT RACES (5:00) Come on over with any boat you wish and with any teammates you wish. We'll get you in a race of like craft and see what you and your boat are made of. Enter the boat races and, well, you could win a ribbon but more likely you'll split a gut laughing and have a great time.

DOCK JUDGING (1:00 – 3:00)

Decorate your dock in true patriotic fashion or even get a little more creative to impress the judges enough to maybe get you into the top 15 spots for some great prizes or the coveted first place bragging rights and a \$100 gift certificate. Last year our 1st place winners unexpectedly put on little skits. We are hoping to have our judges film any of these types of entries this year so we can post them on the blog site for all to enjoy.

Which leaves us with the Fireworks Show. The trademark of our neighborhood.

So, like last year, (but better I hope) here's what we'll do to SIGNAL the START OF THE SHOW. The plan will be to begin setting out the floating lake flares at approximately 10:00 pm. As the floating lake flares are being placed we want everyone to light their dock and beach flares that will be deliv-

ered to your beach or dock before dusk. When the LAST of the lake flares have been set the fireworks contractor will launch aerial parachute signal flares to indicate the show will begin in 5 minutes. NOW HERE'S WHERE YOU ALL COME IN. We want as many of you as possible to purchase an air horn and upon deployment of the flares parachute we want all the air-horns to let out a good 5 second blast or whatever your ears can handle. I think this should get everyone's attention in regards to announcing the start of the show.

(Note: Air horns are available at your local Big 5 or other similar sporting goods stores with mini horns costing around \$8 to the larger horn at about \$17)

Okay, I admit it. Last year's show had ...ummm ...some issues. Mostly caused by the wet weather but also a result of us trying to launch too many mortars on a limited area of raft. The result was some misfires and wet fuses. Well, we fixed them, we have a bigger raft this year and some new firing systems in place to help ensure the show goes off without a hitch. So get ready for our BEST SHOW EVER. We will call it **FINALE** FRENZY and trust me when I say YOU WON'T WANT TO MISS IT because there may never be another one like it on our lake.

SEATAC INTERNATIONAL FESTIVAL - JUNE 25 & 26

For several years this annual event was starting to have an identity crisis, where the event was beginning to evolved into just another summertime festival with your typical array of arts and craft and food vendors that you'd normally find at any neighboring community fair. Two of our lake area residents, Judy Williams and Fuzz Hill, injected their passion and enthusiasm with the Rotary Club and City Planning to help infuse new ideas and new life into the festival with the goal to create a differentiated festival experience that visitors would want to return to through out the weekend.

Many great ideas were considered with the team settling on the following: Create an International Village where booths will showcase any one of the many different cultural

groups found within the SeaTac city boundaries. Participants are being requested to wear traditional dress from their homeland community and to demonstrate goods

from their culture for visitors to gain a greater understanding of their traditions; Food vendors will also offer a more ethnic

fare than the standard midway lineup and will also have smaller sampler portions available for you to eat your way around the park; plus a full two day line up of entertainment will be offered on the main stage and an auxiliary stage placed in the village; and finally the staff at Matt Griffin YMCA will be offering a 'kids village' featuring large blow up activity bouncers and many crafts to keep the wee ones entertained - a purchase of a \$5 wristband entitles them to all day play!

The availability of boat park-

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ing will be new this year. In an interest to get more lakeside residents involved in the festival, the city is allowing boats to tie up to the park dock in an effort to help allevi-

ate automobile parking congestion and provide added convenience for lakeside visitors.
