

2013 FISHING DERBY

Yep, spring is in the air and Shirley, Harlow and Carol Stevens have again graciously agreed to host the 2013 ANGLE LAKE FISHING DERBY this year by allowing the ALSC the use of their beach along with Russ & Patti Austin allowing us the use of their convenient restroom facilities.

Whether you fish or just want to socialize, this event is open to anyone who purchases at least one raffle ticket. This ticket not only enters our fishermen into the derby but also entitles the bearer to morning coffee and donuts followed by a fabulous barbeque lunch and the possibility of winning some awesome raffle prizes.

Good luck to all you anglers and remember that when you arrive to 'check in' you must have your raffle ticket and fishing license (if required by law) in your possession to enter the derby and be eligible for some great derby prizes including the \$100 first prize.

We'll also have a nice bonfire going for those fishing who want to stop in and get warmed up before heading back out on the water and for those that just want to hang out and visit.

Remember that all proceeds from the ticket sales go to support the derby. Last year's revenue from raffle ticket sales did improve and as a result we were able to add a nice kayak to our list of raffle prizes.

Like last year we hope to be adding more raffle prizes providing sales are up. This year our prizes will again consist of two (2) tickets for this year's ALSC Christmas Party (\$60 value), four (4) tickets to this year's Tasty Tapas (\$100 value), Bowling Party gift certificates (each for up to 10 bowlers valued at \$150 each and generously donated by Pat and Val Johns owners of the Hi-Line Bowling Alley) and a grand prize or two that are still to be determined. If you are in a position where you can or would like to donate a raffle prize please contact either myself or Julie Hill to discuss your donation.

The price of a single ticket will again be \$5.00 and while this may seem like a lot it is certainly worth the cost of the lunch alone. For those looking for a better deal you can spend \$10 and get 3 tickets (\$3.33/ticket), or spend \$15 to get 6 tickets (\$2.50/ticket) or spend \$20 to get 10 tickets (\$2.00/ticket). The goal is simply to generate enough money to support this long standing event on its own merit.

Volunteers will be going around the lake to hand out flyers with all the derby details and selling derby tickets door to door starting in early to mid April and if our 2013 directory is ready we'll be handing those out as well. By now I'm sure most of you along the south side are getting use to my visits so remember that the larger the donation the shorter my visit so start saving now. Tickets will also be available on the day of the derby for all you procrastinators.

As always I must remind you that while only one (1) raffle ticket per person is required to enter you into the raffle drawing, to participate in the fishing derby with the first prize for biggest trout set at \$100 and indulge in all the scrumptious food being served we urge you to buy as many tickets as possible. This is not only to increase your chances of winning one of the great prizes offered but also to help support this event. I know there were a lot of questions relative to 'most' people's disappointment (none greater than mine) in last year's FIREWORKS show. I have sent out a few 'official' statements addressing the issue and can assure you that your board has been working hard these past 6 months to help insure this year's show will be THE ONE to remember (in a good way O). After going out to bid to a total of 6 qualified contractors, including the contractor we've used for many years, we received 5 bids in all. In discussions during the bidding process and upon close evaluation of the bids we received, the biggest hurdle we face became quite apparent. The contractor we have used these past many years owns and provides the floating barge assembly that was used to stage our show from the middle of the lake. While all the proposals provided a competitive price for the fireworks themselves, most were unable to come up with a price for a barge assembly and the few that did clearly demonstrated the value that comes along with using our current contractor.

In our open board meeting held at this year's Christmas Party this issue was openly discussed and the result was an overwhelming approval by members present to give our current contractor a second chance this coming year. As a result I am proceeding on that course of action along with adding some contractual language that shall serve as penalty clause(s) to cover damages relating to the contractor's specific performance or rather failure thereof.

Also approved was a motion regarding ALSC funds that were held back as a result of the contractor's nonperformance. With The City committed to co-sponsor the event again this year the ALSC will apply the funds collected last year plus those funds from the collections in 2013 to really enhance this year's show. I have been promised by our contractor that it will be, and I quote, "THE SHOW OF ALL SHOWS". Let's just hope it is, otherwise we'll need to be considering the cost to build an ALSC floating barge for future fireworks shows and that's something we'd like to avoid for a number of reasons.

For this year's TASTY TAPAS we'll be touring the North – South run of the lake. We already have some commitments for station hosts but we still need more. Ideally we need stations on the NE Shoreline, SE shoreline, the point or Southend, the NW shorelines and a dessert station. Please put your heads together and consider teaming up with a neighbor or two. Based on the interesting themes experienced last year from both our stations and tasters, it should prove to be a lot of fun.

Also our WELCOMING COMMITTEE (MARGE MURTHA and KATHY BRYANT) in their second year have done a fabulous job introducing the ALSC to our newest neighborhood residents and providing them with a very complete information packet about SeaTac and the ALSC. Please let Marge or Kathy know if you have, or are aware, of any new neighbors in the area and our Welcoming Committee will take it from there.

Brenda Brodigan Taylor has been in the process of updating our neighborhood PHONE DIRECTORY this year but we could really use some help getting from her draft stage to final publication by way of verifying our existing information. So if you'd like to help out with updating this handy publication please contact Marge Murtha or anyone of your board members to explain our needs further.
