We've got some dates for you! A season does not go by on Angle Lake without a community event to look forward to. The Angle Lake Shore Club sponsors and/or hosts the following events annually. Most activities are free to participate in except where noted below.

Spring

Sunday, April 5th. The Easter Bunny will be dock hopping around the lake on Easter Sunday carrying a basket full of eggs to hand out to all the local ALSC children! Available to all residents and their extended families around the lake.

Saturday, April 25th. The Community Litter Cleanup. Shore Club members are encouraged to join the citywide Annual Litter Clean Up event. Meet at the Tyee Educational Complex to receive gloves, bags, pickers and vests before heading out to clear our neighborhood of trash and debris. Event is hosted by the City of SeaTac and is open to everyone to participate.

Sunday, May 3rd. Angle Lake Fishing Derby. The Derby is open to all members and nonmembers who purchase Derby raffle tickets. A raffle ticket entitles you to a continental breakfast, entrance into the fishing competition, barbecue lunch and a chance to win raffle prizes. Fishing competition prizes will be awarded based upon predefined categories; Raffle prizes will be awarded via random selection.

Summer

Fridays, June through September. It's "Heads and Tails on the 'EI". Each Friday evening (weather permitting) community members will gather at the lake 'elbow' from 6:00 until 8:00 pm to share a frothy mug (heads) and other adult beverages (tails), snacks and conversations. All are welcome.

Saturday, July 4th. Independence Day Activities. Morning activities begin with a fun neighborhood kiddie's street parade followed by the run around the lake competition. The afternoon will include swimming and boating races and, of course, will include our dock / beach decoration contest. Join the Parade of Decorated Boats for a sunset cruise in advance of the fireworks show! All activities are open to members and non-members alike. NOTE: The club intends to resume our long standing tradition of a presenting a fireworks display to the lake community in 2015.

Saturday, July 25th. Lake Bottom Clean Sweep. Community Volunteer Event focused on clearing debris from the shoreline and bottom of Angle Lake. Opportunity for all skills in all conditions walking along the shoreline, snorkeling just below the surface, and even scuba diving in the deeper parts. Volunteer appreciation lunch will be provided and raffle prizes awarded by the ALSC. Open to all.

A flotilla of holiday decorated boats will ferry Santa and his hapless holiday helpers to predetermined stops around the lake spreading seasonal cheer and sharing special surprises. Everyone is encouraged to participate by decorating your boat and joining the parade or watch lakeside with a roaring beach bonfire.

Friday, January 1st. New Years Day. Join us at the Manor Club Private Beach for the annual Polar Bear Plunge! We'll be joining hands at High Noon and then High Tail It through the water to the swim platform and back for small prizes and bragging rights! ALSC Barges Forward with Fireworks Plans

First, I wish to extend my congratulations to the City for putting on a fantastic fireworks display using both the pyro-technician and fireworks contractor that the ALSC played a major role in procuring. And while the show was quite spectacular, it was also small in comparison to past shows and only visible to about 60% of our community from their homes.

Secondarily, I'd like everyone to be informed that the ALSC was not involved in either the production or cost of this show. It was the Board's unanimous decision not to allocate any ALSC funds toward this show due to the number of members who it would not be visible to as a result of it being staged from the existing fishing pier located at Angle Lake Park.

With 2014 being the first year I can recall the ALSC not putting on a fireworks show and from substantial feedback from the members, I know I am not alone in recognizing and feeling that we lost a little community spirit and pride as a result. Witnessing a noticeable reduction in the number of people gathered along the shores, it is very evident that the fireworks show plays a big part in our celebration of the 4th of July so I truly believe we need to pool together to bring back a fireworks show we are proud to share with our family, friends and fellow neighbors.

We all know the saying "fish or cut bait". It's now time to cut last year's bait and begin fishing in the New Year. By this I mean that we need to move forward with our plans to secure our own floating platform from which we can stage future fireworks shows from the middle of the lake for all our members to see. To accomplish this we need to build approximately six (6) individual barges designed and constructed to fit together forming a modular temporary floating platform measuring approximately 1,400 sf. This size of platform should be sufficient to stage up to a \$20,000 show.

To achieve the goal of securing our own floating launch platform we are proposing the following steps:

- Seek out homeowners along the shoreline interested in supplementing their existing docks by partnering with the ALSC in the material construction costs of these barges that will all be built to a standard specification. When completed each barge would then become the sole property of the assigned homeowner after said homeowner signs a lease agreement with the ALSC allowing them unrestricted use of the barge for ALSC events.
- 2. Make a capital call to all members (which would basically equate to what would have been donated for the past year's fireworks contributions) that would be applied solely to the construction of the barges with any surplus funds being deposited into a separate barge maintenance account.
- 3. Find a convenient location on the lake from which we can stage the building of the barges.
- 4. Solicit volunteers to provide labor and tools required to build the barges to ALSC specifications.

Item #1 was discussed at the ALSC Christmas Party meeting and an initial list of interested active members was started. This latest and final notice is to advise all lakefront ALSC 'ACTIVE' members interested in participating in this program to contact either Fuzz Hill or Lonnie Goulet no later than April 18, 2015 for consideration in participating in this endeavor. A meeting will be arranged to describe the partnership in more detail and when we have up to the first six (6) candidates fully committed, we will proceed with securing the necessary paperwork, designs, and materials needed to achieve our goals and look into seeing if producing a fireworks show if feasible for this year or if it we may be forced to wait until next year.

Angle Lake Fishing Derby Moves to a New Spot!

I think it must be almost time to try your luck at the 2015 Angle Lake Fishing Derby. We have a NEW location for the event this year. Bruce & Sandy Goulet will host the party on Sunday May 3rd. They are at post #21 on S 198th St and from the shore just look for the big pinwheels! Fishing starts at the crack of dawn and judging and prizes start at noon.

For those who don't know, The Angle Lake Fishing Derby is a classic community event and has been held annually for many decades. It's always a fun gathering but we'd love to make this one the best yet! We urge all of our lake community members to be involved, especially you who haven't tried it yet. Come out into the great outdoors and participate in a fun, familyfriendly fest!

The derby is not just for anglers. We expect plenty of folks of all ages out on the water casting for lunkers. But fishermen need admirers too. If you're not ready to try your luck on the lake come to the beach for the party. We'll have coffee and doughnuts in the morning followed by a BBQ lunch to warm your bellies. There will be a crackling bonfire on the beach to warm your outsides. It's a fine time to see neighbors you may have missed during the long winter hibernation and to meet new ones.

Prize for the biggest fish is \$115 and there are other prizes in categories based on age. All anglers are eligible – we've had fish catchers from about 3 to 93 years old. A fishing license is required for anyone 15 and older – check with the State department for requirements. One place licenses can be purchased is at Big Five stores.

To make things exciting for all attendees we hold an AMAZING raffle in conjunction with the derby. Prizes include A PAIR OF LAKE KAYAKS, a pair of tickets to the ALSC Christmas party (value \$60), 4 tickets to the Tasty Tapas event in August (\$100 value), Bowling Party certificates good for 10 bowlers each donated by the Johns at Hi-Line Bowl, and at least one more grand prize we're working on now. There will be other fun prizes and the number of total prizes will depend on ticket sales. There will also be prizes for all the kids in attendance and a kid's game to get them moving.

Tickets for the event are good for entry for the derby, food and drink on the beach and as entries for the raffle. Tickets for the derby are \$5 and proceeds are used to pay for the event. You must have a ticket to enter the derby. Most folks will buy multiple tickets to help support the event and get better odds for winning a raffle prize. One ticket is \$5, 3 tickets for \$10 and 10 tickets for \$20. What a deal! Volunteers will be going around the lake to hand out flyers with all the derby details and to sell tickets in mid April. Tickets will also be available for purchase at the event for those who'd like to participate.

Please be generous with your support so that we can continue to host this neighborhood gathering. It warms the heart to see all the involvement of our friends and neighbors. Angle Lake is a great community and it's great because of you!

With the club's success in expanding the clean sweep effort beyond the lake and out onto our local streets, we've decided this year to encourage our Club and Community members to also participate in the City's Community Litter Cleanup Event, as well.



First By Land

The city sponsored Community Litter Cleanup is planned as a concluding event to the Earth Day Week Celebrations held in conjunction with the Spring Recycling Collection Event. Both events will be located at the Tyee Educational Complex Parking Lot.

Oh Where, Oh Where is The Machine Gun?

Do you remember during Clean Sweep last year the recovery of a historical machine gun from the bottom of the lake by resident deep lake diver and president of the ALSC, Lance Goulet?



Well, a letter inquiring about the fate of the gun was sent on August 7th, 2014 to the chief of the SeaTac police, Lisa Mulligan. She responded to the letter on August 15th, 2014.

I, Angle Lake Shore Club advisor, Steve Beck, also had a conversation with the chief in which she described the process of researching the gun's history to see if it was used in a crime. She explained federal, state and King County laws regarding disposition. It would take time.

After hearing no information for over 60 days, I placed a call to Chief Mulligan again and she informed me she had no information on the gun and I should try to contact Detective Corliss who is on the case. I followed up with the detective twice, leaving detailed messages. I finally received a call from detective Corliss and he stated that Washington State has been given the chore to try to figure out the serial number and if the gun has been used in a crime. He

also stated that serious crimes take precedence over an investigation such as this, which is understandable.

I will continue to contact the police to track the progress and whereabouts of this historical machine gun. The fact that the gun is definitely inoperable and has historical/relic value we feel it should be returned to its finder, Launce Goulet providing, of course, it has not been used in a crime.

It would serve no purpose for our law enforcement to cut this machine gun in half or melt it down into bricks for some political recognition on a walkway in Seattle as is now done with other retrieved guns. If we destroy history, we will have none!

As of April 1st, 2015 and after two calls to Detective Corliss and no return calls the next step will be a request under the Freedom of Information Act and a contact to the FBI field office in Seattle for a ruling on this machine aun!

Long Over Due?

It seems that no matter where you turn costs are on the rise but does anyone recall the last time the dues for the Angle Lake Shore Club were raised or for that matter are we certain if they'd ever been raised at all since inception of the club? While the cost of our volunteer labor has remained flat, expense for the materials needed to execute our various shore club events have risen.

During the November board meeting a motion was made to consider an increase in annual membership dues to ensure the quality of our events can be maintained. With the introduction of new events such as the Easter Bunny Dock Hop, Lake Area Clean Sweep, Santa Christmas Cruise and the Polar Bear Plunge, a moderate increase in spending has been realized. However that modest increase is greater when coupled with the continuing uncertainty of our annual fireworks show and the absence of the related fireworks donation drive that has traditionally helped provide the necessary funding to help cover these additional events.

After thorough discussion, the ALSC Board of Directors was of unanimous opinion that the Angle Lake Shore Club dues are due for change. We all agreed that raising our dues is the most prudent method to insure that our events continue as we consider these family centered activities help to exemplify the type of neighborhood that we are proud to live in.

We're confident that you'll also agree that the prior rates charged for membership have been long overdue for a change. As of January 1, 2015 the dues for joining or renewing an ALSC membership will increase for a single member from \$5.00 annual to \$10.00 and a family living under the same roof will increase from the current \$10.00 annual membership fee to \$20.00.

A membership renewal and event order form is conveniently available on the BLOG if you choose to mail in your dues; or use to pay at an upcoming spring event or when our Fishing Derby Volunteers are out later in April selling derby/raffle tickets.

We are most appreciative of our volunteers and the continued financial support of our community that help to make Angle Lake a most desirable place to live. Thank you!

The Firefighters at Station 45, Kent Fire Department RFA, would like to take this chance to introduce ourselves. Angle Lake Fire Station 45 is a specialty station with Firefighters who are certified Rescue Boat Operators and Rescue Swimmers. The safety of the Angle Lake community and citizens using Angle Lake is important to us. We support the water community by training for all types of water rescues. Our training ensures that we are proficient with rescue techniques during water emergencies. We know we may be able to save someone's life with safe and speedy responses, so training to perform proficiently is critical.

There's a saying in the Fire Department, "Train like you fight; fight like you train"; our training needs to be realistic so we can evaluate how to best handle emergencies. With water rescues, this means using our motor boat which gives rapid transport of the Rescue Swimmers to the middle or far reaches of the lake. The boat also gives us a platform from which to work and perform rescues.

We want to train on Angle Lake because it is in our neighborhood and response area, we need to be familiar with the lake and its nuances, and if we ever get dispatched to a call while training, we will be able to respond to the fire or medical emergency because we are still in our response area.

What type of frequency do we need to be proficient with water rescues? Fire Station 45 is staffed with three to five firefighters, 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. The firefighters are divided onto three different shifts. Each shift needs approximately one day per month for water training, which means the boat would be operating at speed for periods of training (1-2 hours) about 3 days per month. We understand that Angle Lake is a "no wake zone" lake and would only operate at speed per training requirements.

It is our hope that the above information answers some of your questions about our boat training on Angle Lake, as well as provides you with insights as to the importance of our training and how it makes the Firefighters proficient with boat operations and rescue responses.

When you see us training on Angle Lake, give us a wave and a shout if you want us to drop by for a "hello". If interested, we will show you our boat and demonstrate a rescue technique that we are practicing that day. Thank you for your support in understanding how important it is for Station 45 firefighters to use our boat to train on Angle Lake. Our training makes your and our community safer!

- Fish measurers (your judges) shall have the right, at their discretion, to reject suspect fish from the contest if suspected to be previously frozen, extremely stiff or cloudy eyed fish (more so than simple cataracts). (2)

- Prizes awarded in each of the following Men's and Women's Age Groups: 0-8, 9-14, 15-59, 60+
- 9. Prize Categories in each Age Group shall be: Biggest Fish, Most Legal Size Trout Caught. Also biggest Non-Trout Prize for Men and Women
- 10. Only one cash prize shall be awarded for the biggest overall fish caught. In the event of a tie a person with the next largest fish shall be deemed the winner. In the event that no third fish was entered then the cash prize shall be split evenly among the two largest fish winners.
