#### **4th of July Fireworks Update**

Tuesday, July 4<sup>th</sup> – the sun shone bright, yet the crowds were light.

Our neighborhood in Angle Lake was presented with a warm summer like day for the Nation's Independence Day Celebration this year. Unlike years previous where we waited until July 5<sup>th</sup> for summer to begin, this year we had already witnessed a few days near 90 leading up to the 4<sup>th</sup> of July events!

The weather this July 4th was a near perfect northwest day with a high of 78 degrees and not a drop of rain expected. Even so, the attendance on the lake was noticeably down from prior years. Could it be due to the holiday not falling on a weekend day? This is not the first time that the 4<sup>th</sup> has fallen on a Tuesday so that can't be likely. Could it be attributed to reduced interest for participating in our traditional event offerings? Reviewing photos of the annual Manor Kiddies Parade; Bud Jones Run/Walk Round the Lake; and the Swim/Boat Races indicate the participation level in those events have pretty much held steady since the fireworks show was moved to the Angle Lake Park Shoreline. So what is it then that is contributing to the lake being so sedate leading up to the fireworks show - Could that be it? The current land based fireworks show itself is actually reducing crowd participation on the lake?

While the City has provided a fine show the past few years – the fact is that producing this incorporated into the production resulting in a much greater visually impactful display!



land based show requires restricting public access to the beach and from swim area and boat ramp use. If boaters hadn't made prearranged plans to launch before the 4<sup>th</sup>, they have found themselves high and dry on the holiday – along with park visitors expecting to frolic in the water leading up to the fireworks display.

Might it be that the best solution for returning to the festive atmosphere of yesteryear is to keep the beach; swim area; and boat launch open to public use by relocating the fireworks display back to the center of the lake. Doing so will not only free up these essential public facilities but will increase the fallout zone radius for the fireworks show itself, allowing for much larger shells to be Thanks to donations from Angle Lake Shore Club members and private homeowner barge investments this change can now be a reality with the use of a floating platform from which the show can be staged. The decision however to relocate the fireworks display to free up the public beach; swim area; and boat launch is a decision that the **City Parks Department Director** will need to make. ALSC representatives are preparing to work with City Staff in pursuit of making this change happen. We encourage our residents and park participants to also support this effort by contacting City Council Members and conveying your interest.
