FRANK HANSON MEMORIAL 'ANGLE LAKE' RACE REGATTA

Volunteers will again be visiting our lakefront residents to present the follow-up survey to the one done last year that helped make this event possible for a one time trial basis. Now that we have experienced the event firsthand, the follow-up survey will be asking for your opinion on whether or not this event should be brought back on an annual basis.

The City has already approved waiving the speed restriction on the lake to pave the way for the annual event but it still must go through the permit process. For those residents in favor of this becoming an annual

event, you will also have the choice as to whether you would like it to be held in the second weekend in September (like last year) or changed to the early part of June. The latter is preferred by the race organizer due to the lake being at a higher level and thus a better possibility of being able to extend the course further down the lake. It would also attract more out of town racers to participate.



Relative to the time of year, consideration should be given to the fact that while there are usually less swimmers in early June vs September (due to the warmer water temperatures in September) the fishing may be more active in early June. Also, I believe, the water park will be open after Memorial Day for those wishing to 'cool off' in early June.

BARGE PROGRAM UPDATE

The Barge Program contributions thru 2/15/17 are now at \$21,901.14 putting us over our revised projected goal of \$21,000.00 by \$901.14.

BARGE UPDATE continued...

For those of you who have supported this endeavor either through donations, volunteer work or simply in spirit, here is

for your awesome accomplishment. Any excess funds shall be reallocated to the emergency fireworks fund that we will be creating.

As of 3/4/17 here is where we are on the Barge Program and Fireworks Show:

- All materials necessary for the Barge Build are now on site.
- 2) 4 out of the 7 total barges have been constructed and launched.
- 3) The formal agreements are complete and a total of \$12,000.00 (\$3,000 per Barge) has been received for the 4 completed Barges while a deposit

THE DOCK DOCKTOR IS IN!

Is your dock in need of repair or are you thinking about adding a dock? If so, you are in



luck. Beginning in April and over the course of the following few months a contractor specializing in dock construction, repair, and piling replacement will be visiting our lake. If you are in need of any dock related services please contact:

- 4) a 5th Barge has also been received. A copy of the agreement is available to any club member for review. All funds received from barge owners shall be allocated exclusively for the emergency fireworks fund.
- 5) This leaves only two barges available with strong verbal interest shown by two parties thus far. Keep in mind however that only the receipt of the required deposit insures ownership.
- 6) The next build dates are scheduled for MARCH 24th thru the 26th, beginning at 9:00 am, and on APRIL 8th thru the 10th for completion and launching.
- 7) With a system now in place for construction we anticipate that we should be able to complete all 3 remaining frames and decking on the first build session. Then on the second build session, using a fork lift, we will flip the barges for installation of the floats, followed by launching them as seen in the video.
- 8) At this time we need volunteers to complete construction of the Barges. If you are a Barge owner or potential owner then it would be in your interest to provide volunteers in accordance with the barge agreement. Anyone else interested in helping may

- 9) There is no doubt that all barges will be ready for the 2017 fireworks show. An ALSC task force is currently meeting with city officials in an effort to coordinate the use of our barges in the middle of the lake for staging of the show.

ANGLE LAKE 2017 FISHING DERBY

Ok, after all this liquid sunshine it's time to welcome spring at the Angle Lake 2017 Fishing Derby. Even the fish are tired of



all this rain and I'm sure they will be ready to hop onto your bait to get out of all that water! Once again Sandy and Bruce Goulet have kindly agreed to host our event (Post # 21). The date is Sunday April 30th. Fishing starts at the crack of dawn and judging and prizes start at noon.



For those who don't know, The Angle Lake Fishing Derby is a classic community event and has been held annually for many decades. It's always a fun gathering but we'd love to make this one the best yet! We urge all of our lake community members to be involved, especially those of you who haven't tried it yet. Come out

into the great outdoors and participate in a fun, family-friendly fest!

The derby is not just for anglers. We expect plenty of folks of all ages out on the water casting for lunkers. However, many of us just come for the food. We'll have coffee and doughnuts in the morning followed

by a barbecue lunch to warm your bellies. There will be a crackling bonfire on the beach to warm your outsides. It's a fine time to see neighbors you may have missed during the long winter hibernation and to meet new ones.

The prize for the biggest fish is \$117 and there are other prizes in categories based on age. All anglers are eligible - we've had fish catchers from about 3 to 93 years old. A fishing license is required for anyone 15 and older - check with the State department for requirements. Licenses can be purchased at Big 5 at 125 SW 148th St in Burien.

The third part of the event is our marvelous raffle in conjunction with the derby. This helps pay for our event and makes life at the lake a little more fun. We'll raffle off a TV and many other special prizes. Volunteers will be going around the lake to hand out flyers with all the derby details and selling tickets in early to mid April. Please be generous with your support so that we can continue to host this neighborhood gathering. It warms the heart to see all the involvement of our friends and neighbors. Angle Lake is a great community and it's great because of you!

Tickets for the derby are \$5 and proceeds are used to pay for the event. You must have a ticket to



enter the derby. In addition to entry into the event, tickets are good for food and drink on the beach and as entries for the raffle of prizes. Most folks will buy multiple tickets to help support the event and get better odds for winning a raffle prize. One ticket is \$5, 3 tickets for \$10 and 10 tickets for \$20. What a deal! Tickets will also be available for purchase at the event for those who'd like to participate.
