Letter From the President

ALL FIRED UP FOR NEXT YEAR'S FIREWORKS SHOW!

After all these years, all it took was finally working with a competent fireworks company to see my vision of what a perfect fireworks show should

look like! HALO FIREWORKS (HF) delivered the goods.

Using old conventional methods of displaying a show all 7 of our barges would have been required to meet current permit requirements. But due to the ability of HF to remotely control the show from the shoreline, the show only required the use of 3 of our barges. Because of this we are FIRED UP and have some ideas for next year that could produce an even more spectacular show.

A great fireworks show does not come cheaply, and this year's show was the most expensive show we have ever put on at Angle Lake. We share the expense of the show with the city of SeaTac and in order to cover the ALSC commitment for the extra cost of the show we asked for donations from the Neighborhood. A big **THANK YOU** goes out to **ADVANCED BROADCAST SOLUTIONS** and **MORTGAGE MASTER SERVICE CORPORATION**, owned by our local residents Mark Siegel and

John & Sharon Porter respectively, who donated \$1500 for the show. We also had volunteers that went around the neighborhood asking for fireworks donations, and thanks to the generosity of our community, we raised enough money to cover our costs for the show, the cost of the flares, and incidental costs incurred to implement all our events for the day. **GREAT JOB TO EVERYONE WHO DONATED!**

The barges proved to be a great platform to launch the fireworks show, but did anyone notice a little fire on one of the barges? Unfortunately one of the 'cakes' outer wrappings caught on fire after deployment of the firework. One of the barges suffered minimal damage (approx. \$500 in material replacement costs) but it could have been worse had we not taken the precautions we did. We put hardy backer liners underneath each of the 'cakes' to prevent this from happening, unfortunately the fire spread just beyond the edges of this protection. HF has agreed to pay for all material costs to replace the damaged deck and the ALSC shall provide the labor to remove and replace the damaged decking thus encouraging a good working relationship for years to come.

Our goal is to try and have an even bigger show next year. We will be working with the City of SeaTac to have them and some private sponsors support the bulk of the cost of the show, and have the ALSC raise the balance to bring you an even better 4th of July fireworks extravaganza. I leave you with this final thought: How much is it worth to have one of the best fireworks shows of South King County right in your backyard that can be enjoyed by thousands of spectators? It would be a big part of what makes this community so very special.

Hydroplane Races: Log 'Boom' or 'Bust'

After witnessing another well-organized event from our friends at the Seattle Outboard Association (SOA) this past 8th and 9th of September I have a few comments and observations to voice.



First, the LOG BOOM (LB) idea was conceived and implemented by the ALSC so our members not able to view the race from their homes could have the option of taking a boat to the log boom to view the race. This is why some of you may have noticed a 120' long vessel that resembled an air craft carrier moving about the lake on Friday and Sunday evening. The LB is assembled and set in the approximate location at the East end of the racing course the night before the race by ALSC volunteers. It is then moved by the SOA on Saturday morning so it is safely outside of the racing course. It is maintained by the SOA throughout the weekend of racing. Upon completion of the event on Sunday evening the log boom is disassembled by ALSC volunteers and individual barges are returned to their respective owners.

We still have some work to do to develop a good anchoring system. The anchoring system we currently have is proving to be inadequate to hold the barges in place when loads are applied due to the overly silty and weedy lake bottom. So this winter we will be working at some modifications that will

correct this problem.

With all this said, it does take a bit of work by volunteers to set the LB and we want to make sure that it is worth the effort. Next year's usage of the LB will determine if we continue the practice. Any comments on this matter will be greatly appreciated.

Second, if you watched the race you might have noticed the absence of the two man 'F Runabout' class and the no shows by the '350 Pro' (laydown boats) class that I promised in the summer newsletter. Unfortunately both classes were adversely affected by personal matters and equipment breakdowns. Hopefully these classes will be represented next year.

Third, many of us think this is an excellent example of one more

way that a body of water can be safely utilized by a family orientated event designed for all ages. For this reason we are encouraging the SOA to work on promotion of the event so that more kids and their parents attend. If you ever get a chance to visit the pit area you will see what I'm talking about when you

see families working together to get their boats and drivers ready to run.

A big thank you goes to Allan Freedman of the Mark Eleven Condominium Association. He provided the radio

broadcast source over the FM 90.5 channel where the SOA announcer reported live race progress, descriptions of the different classes and backstories to some of the racers for a better understanding of Outboard Racing.

Also thanks to these volunteers: Captain Bruce Goulet who showed his skills moving the log boom around, Larry Pistol for giving us a lesson in knot tying and anchor setting and deck hand Fuzz Hill who helped with the log boom. The SOA representative expressed their thanks for our help in making this one of their favorite places to race.
