through club events can lead to and build such a unique and wonderful network of friendships seldom seen in these modern times within America's inner cities or suburban areas. I like to call it 'Old School'. With that said, I know there is always room for improvement so it is my goal to issue a survey by mail to all members asking you to let us know how we are doing. Your participation in this survey will allow the club to continue and tweak events that you favor while perhaps doing major overhauls on others and possibly eliminating those events that receive the lowest ratings or get the least interest.



Here are my main points of interest for 2018:

BARGES: With barge construction finished we are now completing the final paperwork to make it all official. I am happy to report that working within the budget of \$42,531.10 (consisting of money collected from the donation drive and barge sales) we were able to complete the construction of all 7 barges and 4 anchor systems. We were also able to set in reserve \$500 to buy 2 more anchoring systems and retain \$2,693.54 for a Maintenance Fund to be used solely for use in repairing damage incurred to barges while

in the possession of the ALSC. The barges will be useful not only for the 4th of July but also for the Fishing Derby, Clean Sweep and Hydroplane Races. Thank you to everyone who supported this effort.

FIREWORKS: The Club has reached an agreement with the City to produce the fireworks display from private barges located in the center of the lake. This move allows the swim beach and park hillside to remain open and unrestricted for public access and increases viewership from the new nature trail area as well. The Board fully recognizes the importance of making this year's show one heck of a display to reward the community for the all the effort it took to complete our barge program. As of March 2nd, the agreement with the City is to produce a \$20,000 show. Of this amount, the Parks Dept. along with commercial sponsors will finance \$16,000 with the remaining \$4,000 guaranteed by the Shore Club.

As a policy, the Shore Club maintains a current minimum reserve for fireworks. In the event that we cannot find additional commercial sponsors for the Club's guaranteed portion, it will be paid out of this reserve fund. If this occurs, we'll need to replenish the \$4,000 this year to ensure the Fireworks Fund minimum reserve balance

is maintained. We've typically collected these funds with volunteers going door to door so look for more information in our summer newsletter regarding this matter.

2018 PHONE DIRECTORY: We know that ALL of you living around the lake always look forward to our yearly doorbelling visits when we sell raffle tickets to support our annual fishing derby so we thought what better time for verifying names, addresses and phone numbers for use in updating our member's neighborhood directory. With everyone's cooperation we hope to get a new directory out by the end of May. We accept ads for the directory, if you would like to highlight your business or service.

TASTY TAPAS: Another reminder that we are intending to navigate the West to East leg of the lake this year. If you are interested in keeping this fun tradition alive and have waterfront property on this run of the lake, please let us know if you would consider hosting a station as early as possible.

I thank each one of you for your active and/or financial participation and helping to make our neighborhood one that I am proud to be a part of.

ANGLE LAKE 2018 FISHING DERBY

Once again, Sandy and Bruce Goulet have kindly agreed to host the Fishing Derby (Post # 21). The date is Sunday April 22nd. Fishing starts at the crack of dawn and all contestants must be docked at the Goulet's dock by noon, which is when we will start the judging and awarding of prizes.

The Angle Lake Fishing Derby is a classic community event and has been held annually for many decades. It's always a fun day for fishers and non fishers alike starting with breakfast and ending

with a great barbecue and prizes.

We urge all of our lake community to be involved, especially those who haven't tried it yet. Come out into the great outdoors and participate in a fun, family-friendly fest! The derby is not just for anglers. There will be plenty of folks of all ages out on the water casting for lunkers but many of us just come for the food! We'll have coffee and doughnuts in the morning followed by a barbecue lunch that often features salmon along with burgers and hotdogs and great salads.

There will be a crackling bonfire on the beach to warm you and tents to shelter you in case of rain. It's a fine time to see neighbors you may have missed during the long winter hibernation and to meet new ones.

The prize for the biggest fish is \$118. There are lots of other prizes in categories based on age. All anglers are eligible we've had fish catchers from about 3 to 93 years old. A fishing

license is required for anyone 15 and older – check with the State department for requirements.

Licenses can be purchased at Big 5 at 125 SW 148th St in Burien.

The third part of the event is our exciting raffle in conjunction with the derby. This helps pay for the derby and gives everyone, present or not, a chance to win. We'll raffle off many valuable prizes. Volunteers will be going around the lake to hand out flyers with all the derby details and selling tickets in early to mid April. Please be generous with your support so that we can continue to host this popular event. You don't need to be present to win so have some return address labels handy

when we come by and put them on your tickets. That way, when you win, we can deliver your prize. Tickets for the event are good for entry to the derby, food and drink and as entries for the raffle



of prizes. Single tickets for the derby are \$5. You must have one ticket to enter the derby and/or eat lunch. Most folks buy multiple tickets to help support the event and get better odds for winning a raffle prize. One ticket is \$5, 3 tickets for \$10, 6 for \$15 and 10 tickets for \$20. What a deal! Tickets will also be available for purchase at the event for those who'd like to participate. If you arrive by boat, car or on foot we'll look forward to seeing you April 22nd.
