If it floats, then we'll let you race it! Show up in any kind of water craft and we'll find a category to put you in. Join in the fun and paddle, pedal, row or sail your way to victory. Boat races will begin immediately following the completion of the swim competition at Louvier's Beach at post 46.

7:30 pm – Parade of Decorated Boats

Calling all Captains. We're looking for you and your crew to join other neighbors and their boats in a evening parade around the lake! Share your holiday cheer with those onshore or perhaps prepare for some wholesome "Super Soaker Battles" out on the high seas!

10:00 pm – The 4th of July Finale

The fireworks display will be fired off the club/private

partnership barges this year and will be anchored at the Lake elbow this year. Returning the display to the center of the lake allows the use of the larger 6" shells to be used, resulting in a spectacular display of explosions filling the sky for an ultimate visual treat. Please note that for safety reasons the lake must remain clear of watercraft; They must stay no less than 420 ft away from the fireworks barges. Any intrusion within this safety parameter will delay and/or will prevent the show from being fired.

Events of this size cannot be done without the help and cooperation of many people. A special and sincere thank you is given to each of the volunteers who have donated their time in helping to coordinate these events and to all our Angle Lake neighbors who have donated financially. Letter from the President

IT'S IN THE WORKS FIREWORKS THAT IS!

Yep ... It's time. Time to put all our time, labor, money and overall effort we invested in our barge program to the test this 4th of July. Utilizing our temporary floating platform, comprised of our barges, the City is moving the fireworks show back to the middle of the lake! This opens up the beach area for public use on the 4th of July and the days leading up to it.

This year's show will be staged by HALO FIREWORKS. HALO is unique from other fireworks contractors used in the past due to their ability to perform their show by means of remote control where the pyrotechnician will be firing the show from the shoreline instead of on the barges. If this technology proves successful, it opens up some other interesting options and ideas for enhancing future shows.

Also the ALSC shoreline residents will bring back our long standing tradition of putting out flares down the middle of each leg of the lake and around the shoreline just prior to the fireworks show. This display really sets the mood for the fireworks show for all spectators.

If you recall the article in our spring newsletter, the ALSC guaranteed \$4,000 towards this year's show. Thanks to contributions by ADVANCED BROADCAST SOLUTIONS and

MORTGAGE MASTER SERVICE CORPORATION, owned by our local residents Mark Segale and John & Sharon Porter respectively, the ALSC is left with a balance of \$2,500 to contribute. So in order to maintain our fireworks reserve fund you can expect our volunteers to be paying you a visit prior to the 4th, handing out flyers, asking for fireworks donations and hopefully handing out updated phone directories for our current members.

Tenth Anniversary Tasty Tapas is Coming August 11th!

It's hard to believe that 2018 marks the 10th year of the Angle Lake Shore Club's Tasty Tapas event. Many in



our community have attended every one as they consider it one of the funnest events of the year. So I'd like to take this occasion to urge neighbors who have not yet experienced this fest to join us. This year we'll travel the southern long leg of the lake in search of

the lake in search of bites and beverages. I especially want to ask those with beach access on the South side of the lake to consider hosting one of our stations for this event. After ten years many of our neighbors have enjoyed hosting this soiree, some multiple times, and perhaps it's now your turn!

Who can host? Rule of thumb would be anyone who can even vaguely see the park from their shore is in a splendid spot. We need 4-5 tasting stations and 1 dessert station for the event. This year's date is August 11th 2018.

What's involved in hosting? It's pretty simple – each host picks a theme for their station menu and prepares a couple of choices of bite sized appetizers for your guests. Could be a country's fare or a style of food you like to make or just a couple yummy



things. Some hosts have even had their station catered. You will also provide beverages that may fit your theme. It's usually easy to serve on disposable dishes to ease the work. Ticket sales are divided between our hosts so you'll have a budget of up to \$600 or so to work with. We've found that a crew of 4 or more helps keep everything running smoothly so many

We split the guests into 4 groups of 25-35 folks and each group rotates around the lake sampling the fare at each tasting station. The cost to attend this event is still only \$30/person. We seem to have more pontoon boats than ever on the lake. They earn their name because the drivers literally lay flat on their stomachs positioned about a foot above the water with the

steering wheels at the very front of the boat.

wide array of outboard boat racing at its best. In addition to what we have seen in the past, this year's FHMR race at Angle Lake, will be the hosting the NORTH AMERICAN CHAMPIONSHIPS FOR 'C STOCK HYDRO.' In this class you can expect to see the best in competitive racing at speeds close to 70 mph.

In the past 2 years of this event drivers have used either the sitting or kneeling positions while racing runabouts and hydroplanes at speeds ranging from 35 to 85 mph. But this year you will see a SPECIAL TREAT Condominium Association will be providing radio broadcasting over FM 90.5 where an SOA announcer will be reporting live race progress, descriptions of the different classes and backstories to some of the racers for a better understanding of Outboard Racing.


