

High Five to the High Dive As We Say A "FOND **FAREWELL"**

ISSUE 1

If you live on or around Angle Lake, you might be aware of the High Dive Tower located in the Cove at the SE corner of the lake. The current dock for the Dive Tower was built years ago using cedar logs cut in the 1930s from the Jarnig property (one of the first homestead



properties on the lake). It was maintained by the 'Cove Community*' (*Andrew J. Jarnig and the Nelson and Rollison families). Those same logs, 80+ years later, still serve as the means of floatation. At first, the dock was equipped with a homemade version of an elevated spring board made from an old jump/buck board and model T springs for extra boost. In the 50's the Cove Residents, led by Andrew J. Jarnig, constructed the current Dive Tower and the spring board was later removed. Years ago, it was one of 7 total dive towers that graced the shores of

Angle Lake. For five generations this tower has stood the test of time drawing only the bravest swimmers to jump.

Memories of the Dive Tower are endless. It is hard to say how many dives, cannon balls, belly flops and can openers were displayed. Over five generations the Dive Tower has been a unique and fun place to meet

> families. Many swimmers have passed "the swim test" to swim out from a shore dock to the Dive Tower. For years the Angle Lake Fourth of July swim races were staged from the Moorehead's beach with the starting point at the Dive Tower's dock. Many beautiful

dives and not so pretty belly flops have been made. Sometimes divers would turn around and go back down the ladder only to return and finally jump! It was fun just to hear the screams and laughter as we watched people jump, sharing in the joy of their moment.

Maintenance was endless, especially in later years as the Dive Tower drew more enthusiastic swimmers some of whom did not respect the history or age of the structure. Despite the best efforts by the Dive Tower's current group of stewards the dive dock fell into disrepair.

The late Lee Brown (AKA "The Keeper of the Dive" and resident of the cove since 1982) was

instrumental in taking the lead to make necessary repairs. With help from the Murphy and Tonnamaker Families they managed to keep the Dive Tower in a safe and usable condition. Each time the structure decided to break its moorage and take a tour of the lake it was Lee who ventured out and

towed it back to shore until weather allowed for the necessary repairs. With Lee's passing late last year those who continued to be involved with the upkeep realized that maintaining the dock in safe condition exposed them to liability and put them at risk.

Earlier this year, during high winds, the Dive Tower broke loose from it's chained mooring for the last time. After it drifted for a day Bruce Goulet and Jim Todd

went to the rescue and towed it to shore. After inspecting it closely and doing some soul searching the cove residents, with tears and sad regret, made the decision to retire the tower as of March 2019. It may not be there physically, but its 80 plus year legacy will forever be a part of our memories.

Perhaps this is just a sign of the times. The common sense of yesteryear has been

taken over by rules and regulations and subsequent risks of liability for the carelessness of others. Let's hope lake residents in generations to come will invent ways to bring new joy and thoughtful stewardship to our beautiful Angle Lake. This is what we, the Angle Lake Shore Club, strive to create.

So here's a HIGH FIVE to the sounds of laughter and joy that were and always will be heard on the lake. But, alas, no more from the historic sentinel of the lake, our beloved High Dive Tower!
