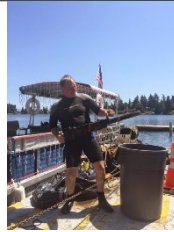

Later you'll have the chance to splash your way to victory in our swim or boating races. Or simply plant yourself onto a blanket to cheer on your favorite competitors in each of these

all-American Fourth of July celebrations! Angle Lake's traditional festivities definitely offer great variety and are a true reflection of the all-American historical Independence Day celebrations held throughout the generations.

9:30 am - Kiddies Parade Preparations

Show up after 9:30 at the starting line for an opportunity to pick through a wide array of decorations to adorn your trike; bike; stroller, dog or yourself demonstrating your patriotic pride.

10:00 am - Angle Lake Manor Club Parade



Pull up a chair to cheer on your neighbors in the Children's and Community Parade. The 2020 WEEKEND CELEBRATION will provide the perfect backdrop for an AWESOME Family & Friends get together not only at the park but also around the lake and

"HERE FISHY, FISHY"

Zealous anglers fished all areas of the lake and docks in an attempt to snag some of those 5,500 Rainbow Trout released by the Washington Department. of Fish and Wildlife on April 1, 2019. (So they said!)

Interesting facts:

"Rainbow trout can be identified by their bluish-green back, silver sides and belly and black spots on the body and on the caudal,

Angling opportunities in Angle Lake include catchable and larger size Rainbow Trout, Largemouth Bass, Black Crappie, Yellow Perch and Kokanee. Perch and Kokanee fishing can be good in the summer months."



Many children really enjoyed fishing from the large dock area created by the assembly of the barges. A big thanks to



dorsal and adipose fins. Another characteristic of rainbow trout, which gives the fish its name, is the frequent presence of a reddish stripe along its sides. Rainbow trout average 11-18 inches in length but can grow to more than 20 inches in quality populations.
