Hello, we've got members of our Shore Club Team assigned out on the streets of the Angle Lake Community to report out on the hugely successful celebration that took place in observance of our Nation's Independence Day Holiday. Each year the Angle Lake Shore Club hosts several family-oriented events and collaborates with the residents of the Manor Club in producing a neighborhood parade. All of these activities transpire throughout the day and lead up to the Grand Fireworks Display to finish out the day.

Bud Jones Memorial Walk/Run 'Round the Lake.

John and David Seidenberg are calling an early start to the day – 9:00AM! Following a 5k course leading entirely around the lake, our Walkers set out on a somewhat leisurely, social stroll ahead of the Runners, who in particular will be competing for the overall title of 'Fastest on the Lake'. All other finishers will compete for 1st place recognition in their gender and age brackets. Each participant result is tracked through their official race bib assignment. While the number of walkers participating was down this year, the race event attracted over 30 runners competing for ribbons, however only one can be recognized as the overall fastest finisher and that recognition goes to Bib Number 49, Tyler Siedenburt with a finishing time of 19:42! Tyler was awarded the highly coveted 'Angle Lake Fastest Runner' trophy, Congratulations Tyler!

We now head to the other side of the lake where the Angle Lake Manor Community Parade is being organized by Jonathan Standridge. Parade participants feverously plowed through the table of various holiday decorations in effort to adorn their bikes, wagons, animals and themselves! The parade was led by the Fire Department Honor Guard and fire trucks. Lots of noise was generated notifying the Angle Lake Neighborhood that the parade was underway. Behind the fire trucks came about 125 decorated children on their bikes and wagons along with some colorfully decorated adults.

Fran Reid brought the band together in her usual spectacular fashion. The truck and trailer were driven once again by Tony Anderson. The trailer for the band was supplied by Andy Pompeo. John Porter and his family supplied the chariot for Tani Rae (The ALM Queen) and accompanying vintage car. Once again John was generous with his time and use of his beautiful Red Thunderbird. The parade ended with a well-attended Ice Cream Social and Sing Along led by Fran Reid. John Bennett supplied about 350 popsicles and the ALM added about 150 ice cream bars. So for the first time, there was plenty to go around. Pat Patterson once again supplied the sound system which was much appreciated. Many other volunteers helped at intersections and crowd control. Jonathan remarked "We couldn't have done this without you all".

Let's now head over to the Southwest side of Angle Lake, meeting up at the Petitt Beach for the start of the second annual Paddleboard Poker Race. Speed doesn't always win the race; it just gives you an extra card. The luck of the cards and the skill in playing made for a fun day for all. As they say... it's better to be lucky than good! While Jim Riley made it back first, he was awarded the first-place ribbon. But then we had a playoff when two of our players each had four of a kind with threes. This only happens when you're playing with five decks. But in the play off, Nancy won with a pair of fours! taking home a super cool trophy! But everyone was a winner for joining and we all had a ton of fun! We look forward to this event continue to grow year over year.



Casting our sights down toward the Northeast side of the lake, we see groups gathering along the shore to cheer on the race participants competing in the ALSC Water Races. Event Director, Gregg Louvier claims that every year the collection of competitors change – never knowing ahead of time how the classifications will be organized, he openly confesses that the race heats are identified and assigned on the spot! In fact, the boat races might not actually consist of boats – but more so, comprised of anything that floats! This is a true indication how this event is more focused on fun than prizes!

The warm weather had brought out lots of swimmers! By 2pm the lanes were set up between dock to dock marking the course. At the start 28 racers had participated this year with many more on the shore cheering them on!!

First up were the Ages 2 to “older”, after which the younger children’s “races” (some accompanied by parents) took place along the shore, and the older children headed out to race in the lanes, dock to dock. Each of these participants were awarded a 4th of July race ribbon and shiny golden US dollar coin for their efforts! The call then went out for an adult race which featured a “mothers to race.” Not to disappoint, three mothers headed for the starting line. This then led to a fathers/grandfather’s relay. Races were enjoyed by all.

A special thanks to the Ron Harvey family and Jeanne Louvier for use of your yards and docks that made hosting the event possible. And congratulations to everyone who competed on won their categories. We then head directly across the lake to Jim and Robyn Todd Beach to witness a collection of boats preparing to depart on the evening ALSCFestive Boat Float. This year we removed the decorative dock competition in favor of having a decorated boat parade instead. The number joining the parade was impressive, although it seems the message to decorate your vessel fell short. The spirit and festiveness of the convoy far outweighed where decorations fell short, and anticipation ran high waiting for big water battles between super soakers to ensue! We’re anxious to see how this plays out again next year!



As the sun began to wane and the sky darkened, Ben Austin deployed the lighted flares down the center legs of the lake and waterfront neighbors followed his lead, ignited their flares around the entire shoreline, creating the Russ Austin Memorial 'Ring of Fire', signaling the impending start of our Grand Fireworks Display! Through the many years effort, Lonnie Goulet and Bruce Goulet have helped Angle Lake to become the region's premier event, hosting the only remaining fireworks display in the South Seattle/Highline Area.

The Frank Hansen Memorial Regatta brought to you by the Seattle Outboard Association as a sanctioned Seafair Community Partner boat racing event, will be held on **September 9th and 10th, 2023** at Angle Lake Park in SeaTac, Washington.

The event will feature two full days of boat racing excitement, as well as a variety of other activities, including:

- Seafair clowns
- Food trucks
- 9/11 commemorative event
- Seafair Cup awarded to J-series hydroplane drivers

The races will take place on the west leg of the lake from **10am to 4pm** on both Saturday and Sunday. Sunday will feature the 9/11 commemoration starting at 9:30am, with the Seafair J-Series Gold Cup Trophy being awarded later in the day.

Spectators will be welcomed into the Race Pits for self-guided tours.

Entry into the race pits requires spectators to sign a waiver and wear close-toed footwear.

Angle Lake Clean Sweep



SeaTac, WA (July 15, 2023) - A group of volunteer scuba divers from SeaTac and surrounding communities gathered at Angle Lake on Saturday for a cleanup effort that removed several bags of trash and debris from the lake's bottom.

Rotem Yossef, an Angle Lake resident who has been diving for over 30 years, organized the diving event. Yossef said he was inspired to organize the cleanup after seeing the amount of trash that had accumulated on the lake's bottom.

"I love Angle Lake, and I wanted to do something to show my appreciation for it," Yossef said. "I think it's important for people to realize that our waterways are not a dumping ground for trash."

The cleanup volunteers spent several hours diving in the lake at depths of over 35 feet, retrieving trash from the bottom. They found everything from plastic bottles and food wrappers to oars and swim masks. "It was amazing to see how much trash we were able to remove from the lake," Yossef said. "I'm so grateful to the volunteers who helped out. The SeaTac Scrub Down was a success, and the volunteers removed 90 bags of trash collected from several points around the City, including the lake.
