The Washington Department of Ecology (Ecology) received comments from 12 individuals about the application for coverage under the Aquatic Plant and Algae Management General Permit (permit) submitted by the City of SeaTac for the management of aquatic plants within Angle Lake in King County, Washington. This letter is Ecology's response to comments.

Thank you for providing your comments and input. The City of SeaTac has decided <u>not</u> to use chemical herbicide treatments on Angle Lake. Instead they plan to use only mechanical control methods for Fragrant Water Lilly in certain areas of the lake. More details are available in the attached letter from Mike Fitzpatrick.

As a result, Ecology will not be issuing permit coverage for Angle Lake at this time.
